Why is it important?

- Whether you are a permanent resident, have a visa or are undocumented, you can be stopped by the police and questioned about your immigration status
- Everyone has legal rights in this country, however, regardless of your immigration status

Immigration in Your Home

- Immigration (and Police) may only enter your home if:
 - They have a warrant; OR
 - You have given them permission; OR
 - There is an EXTREME emergency situation

What is a warrant?



- A warrant is a piece of paper signed by a judge that gives permission to any officer to do something specific
 - Search warrant: will have a specific address
 - Arrest warrant: Has a name or Alias

I have determined that there is probable cause to believe that _____ is removable from the United States. This determination is based upon:

- the execution of a charging document to initiate removal proceedings against the subject;
- the pendency of ongoing removal proceedings against the subject;
- the failure to establish admissibility subsequent to deferred inspection;
- biometric confirmation of the subject's identity and a records check of federal databases that affirmatively indicate, by themselves or in addition to other reliable information, that the subject either lacks immigration status or notwithstanding such status is removable under U.S. immigration law; and/or
- statements made voluntarily by the subject to an immigration officer and/or other reliable evidence that affirmatively indicate the subject either lacks immigration status or notwithstanding such status is removable under U.S. immigration law.

YOU ARE COMMANDED to arrest and take into custody for removal proceedings under the Immigration and Nationality Act, the above-named alien.

In a Car

- The police can stop a car if:
 - They have a good reason to think the car was involved in a crime;
 - They saw you commit a traffic offense; or
 - They have road blocks to randomly inspect cars for a specific reason

In a Car

- You must give the police:
 - Your name
- Rights:
 - To remain silent
 - To see an arrest warrant
 - To speak to a lawyer, and
 - To make a phone call

Immigration in a Public Place

- Officers may approach you in a public place to ask questions at any time
- To arrest you on the street without a warrant, an officer must believe you have committed a crime

Immigration at your Job

- Police or Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) may come in to your workplace at anytime
- Your rights still apply
 - Right to remain silent
 - Right to speak with an attorney
 - Right to make a phone call
 - Right to see a warrant

Attorneys

- In the United States, only **ATTORNEYS** are licensed to practice law
- To see if the person you are working with is an attorney you can search: Indiana Roll of Attorneys and find their name
- **NEVER** take advice from a non-attorney; even if they are just trying to help, they may not know all the changes

General Advice

- Keep all important paperwork in a safe place
- If you are UNDOCUMENTED (i.e. No status) --Do NOT carry foreign ID (like Matricula)
- If you have legal status (TPS, Green Card, DACA) carry proof of that status at all times
- Memorize a number of a friend or attorney to call in case of an emergency
- Do create a safety plan!
