## ***Important Steps to Take to Prepare for an Emergency***

- Keep important documents such as passports, IDs, birth certificates, immigration documents, social security card, important information regarding children, and anything else you would want to be able to find quickly in a safe place, and tell your emergency contact where they can find them.
- Make a plan with your emergency contact for what to do if you have children or others you care for
- Memorize the number of your emergency contact or an attorney in case you are detained

## ***5 Things to Know if You are Stopped by Immigration***

- If you are here with permission, carry copies of your documents with you.
- If you are stopped by the police or immigration, give them your true name, but then remain silent.
- If immigration comes to your home, do not open the door and ask if they have a warrant. If they do, ask them to slide it under the door.
- If you are detained and afraid to return to your home country, tell the officer “I am afraid to return to my home country and I need to speak to somebody about that”
- Remember that you have the right to speak to an attorney and consult with one before you sign anything if you are detained.
